Mireille studied law at the University of Malta, graduating with a Diploma of Notary Public in 2000 and Doctor of Laws (LLD) in 2002. She was called to the Bar in 2003. She subsequently obtained an LLM in Computer and Communications Law from Queen Mary, University of London in 2008.

Mireille is currently a researcher within the Centre for IT & Law at the University of Bristol (UoB). Her main research interests are privacy and data protection, with a focus on the use of personal data in the criminal justice sector in Europe. In closely-related research, she is also a co-investigator in the PUIE (Police Uses of Personal Information across Europe) 2010-2012 project, funded by the Council of Europe. One deliverable of the project will be a Report containing an overview survey across the 47 member states of the Council of Europe of the adoption and implementation of Recommendation R(87)15 during its 24 years of existence, to be presented to the Council of Europe's T-PD plenary session in November this year.
